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FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

With over 600 medical facilities across the United States (4 clinics in Georgia), Planned Parenthood promotes itself as the leading women's healthcare provider, offering a wide variety of women's low-cost health services. They are funded by large corporations, individuals, fundraising events, and receive between 1.5 - 1.7Ma DAY in government funding. For decades, Planned Parenthood has had the

resources to reach and influence the pregnancy decisions of the majority of women facing unplanned pregnancies. First Care Women's Clinic plans to change that!

The vision of First Care Women's Clinic is to continue to increase our women's healthcare services so that we can develop on-going relationships with women of childbearing age in our area of influence. As we become the medical alternative to Planned Parenthood, we will have a strong life-affirming influence in our community.

Our time line for growth marked 2020 as a banner year for growth. With two supervising physicians; Dr. Mull, OB/GYN and Dr. Blom, Radiology, our plan was to hire a Nurse Practitioner who would have the licensing to administer pelvic exams, microscope testing, diagnose, administer, and prescribe treatments. As an essential facility, we were able to keep our doors open during the COVID pandemic. In the first 3 months of the pandemic, the number of abortion minded women we were seeing tripled.

There is no doubt that the pandemic made 2020 a challenging year. We scrambled to serve patients with a portion of staff out on a regular basis because they either had or were exposed to COVID. We also experienced a decrease in patients as people sheltered in place.

Despite the challenges, First Care Women's Clinic hired a Nurse Practitioner in the 2nd quarter of 2020. We increased our medical services to include pelvic exams and microscope testing. A pandemic did not alter God's vision for His ministry.

Your faithful support carried us through 2020 and we are so grateful! Be encouraged that the fruit of your giving is life itself.



COUNTIES THAT PERFORM ABORTIONS AND THE COUNTIES WITH A RESIDENT ABORTION RATE OF 500 OR HIGHER.



Performed Abortion Rate – The number of abortions performed in a county regardless of what county the person having the abortion is from. 96% of the counties in Georgia do not perform abortions.

Resident Abortion Rate – The number of residents of a county who have abortions regardless of where they are performed.

Counties with abortion clinics operating in them have both performed and resident abortion statistics. Counties with no abortion clinics operating in them have a resident abortion statistic which means that their residents must go elsewhere to have their abortions.






JOCELYN'S STORY

So many women feel hopeless and without support when the fathers of their unborn children walk away. The main reason women choose abortion is because they feel they do not have the support they need to carry and parent their children. This is Jocelyn's story

19 year old Jocelyn came to FCWC for a pregnancy test. She was in a difficult relationship with her boyfriend who said that if she was pregnant, he did not want the baby. She loved him and became very depressed when he rejected her pregnancy. Like so many women, not having the support of the father of her unborn child made her feel that abortion was her only option. Jocelyn always believed that abortion was wrong until she was faced with the




choice of aborting her baby or losing her boyfriend. When her counselor talked to her about the humanity of her unborn child, she had a change of heart and decided to carry her baby. She took a stand for life with her boyfriend who continued to push her to have an abortion. Seeing her baby's image on the ultrasound screen did not lift the depression she felt. Over time and with the support of her counselor and family, her depression lifted and she is excited every time she feels the baby move in her womb. Her boyfriend is now much more excited about the pregnancy. They continue to struggle as a couple but have made a commitment to parent their baby together!


FIRST CARE WOMEN'S CLINIC 1

The Capital Campaign for the purchase, renovation, and furnishing of the new facility in 2015/2016 resulted in a spike in both expense and income for those two years.



Cash Reserve has increased as we prepare to open satelite centers in the coming years.

FUNDRAISING METHODS

- Walk for Life. Walkers secure pledges from sponsors to raise funds, awareness, and visibility for the cause and the center.
- Banquet. A fundraising event featuring a pro-life speaker, testimonies, and abortion-related subjects is held each fall. Attendance is approximately 600-800 persons.
- Open Houses/Private Dinners. Small, intimate meetings with current and potential donors are held to promote FCWC.
- Email Marketing. Email blasts using Constant Contact are sent to all donors to update them on the organization and encourage donations for various campaigns e.g.,


yearend giving, Mother's Day, and baby bottle drives.

- Quarterly Newsletter. Newsletters are mailed to donors with information regarding abortion, center statistics, center events, etc. Each newsletter also requests donations.
- Year End Appeal Mailings. In addition to email marketing, a yearend appeal is made for funds to support the ministry, and is mailed to all donors.
- Baby Bottle Drives. Churches and Christian schools are encouraged to support FCWC by having members fill baby bottles with loose change.
- Foundations/Grants. FCWC pursues funds from private

and public foundations, and church affiliates. It does not accept government or any funding that would restrict its ability to share the gospel with clients.

When deploying these methods, FCWC frequently solicits pledges from current and potential donors to secure monthly funding.

MINISTRY PLANS FOR 2021

"See I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

The timeline of growth below depends on our financial ability, filling open postions, and when the COVID threat lifts.

MEDICAL:

- The Nurse Practitioner completed supervised exams in 2020 and is now able to administer unsupervised pelvic exams and swab testing in 2021. We can now:
 - Offer swab testing to patients who call for urine and blood testing
 - Accept appointments for patients who call requesting specific swab tests.

Because the Nurse Practitioner has the licensing, we can continue to expand our lab testing. We now have



the capacity to send specimens to lab for testing or use onsite microscope testing for pelvic swabs.

- **1.** We will transfer to an Electronic Medical Records System. We have researched several system options and have chosen AdvancedMD.
- 2. Research additional medical services we can add this year; specifically ABORTION PILL REVERSAL
- 3. Prepare for AAAHC 3rd year re-accreditation scheduled for the fall of 2021

CLIENT SERVICES

• We will revise our training manual and fine tune our training models for greater impact in the counseling rooms. Because the greatest need of the women and men we serve is Jesus, refining the way we present the gospel is a major focus in 2021.

• Begin an on-going support group for men

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SATELLITE CENTERS IN COBB COUNTY

AUSTELL AREA OF COBB

Our objective is to open a satellite center in the Austell/Mableton/ Smyrna/Six Flags area of Cobb County. This area has an average household income below the national and state average, higher population of women under the age of 40, higher crime, sex trafficking, and drug use.

In 2021, we will aggressively seek the funding necessary to rent a

facility on a main road near Cobb Hospital, renovate the building to

meet medical code, furnish, and staff. The startup budget for the Austell satellite center is \$350,000.00. We have secured \$100,000.00 of the funds needed.

WE PLAN TO OPEN THE AUSTELL SATELLITE CENTER IN 2022 AND BEGIN OPERATING.

KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY (KSU) CAMPUS

Students attending KSU have access to the campus clinic as part of their tuition. The highest percentage of women with unplanned pregnancies are between the ages of 19-24. Women who are attending colleges are at risk for unplanned pregnancies that end with abortion. Female students need more than a list of abortion clinics when they go to a medical clinic for help.

To reach female students on the KSU campus, we will first develop a relationship with them by offering a variety of medical services similar to those offered by the campus clinic.

For our clinic to reach the medical level needed to serve the KSU female students, we will need our facility to be within walking distance, have a full medical staff that will include a Nurse Practitioner, and highly skilled consultants.

Because real estate, staffing, and medical services are much more costly for the KSU clinic, the start-up budget for opening a clinic at KSU is 1.2M.
